# Home Safety Inspection

By completing this home safety inspection, you will make your home a safer place for you and your family!

Heating Equipment	Yes	No	Fixed
Are your clothes, furniture and curtains at least 12" away from heaters, woodstoves or fireplaces?			
Do you clean your chimney every year before using it again?			
Matches, Lighters and Smoking Materials	Yes	No	Fixed
Are Matches and lighters kept out of reach of children?			
Are ashes from smoking and the fireplace put in a closed metal can outside?			
Do smokers smoke in bed or on sofas when sleepy?			
Kitchen and Cooking	Yes	No	Fixed
When cooking: are pan handles turned in and are cords kept from dangling where children can pull on them or they can accidentally be bumped?			
Are coffee pots, toaster and other electric appliances unplugged when not in use?			
Are cleaning supplies kept out of children's reach?			
Are ground fault interrupters installed at outlets near sinks?			
Do you have a fire extinguisher in the kitchen?			
Bathroom	Yes	No	Fixed
Are medicines kept in child resistant containers?			
Are space heaters, curling irons, electric razors and blow dryers turned off and unplugged before you leave the bathroom?			
Are ground fault interrupters installed at outlets near sinks?			

<b>Bedroom</b>	<b>Yes</b>	<b>No</b>	<b>Fixed</b>
Are space heaters and/or baseboard heaters placed away from beds, drapes and furniture?			
Can bedroom windows be opened? (This is important in case you need to use it as an emergency escape.)			
Do you have a smoke detector installed in the hallway outside your bedrooms?			
Do you have smoke detectors installed in each bedroom?			
Do you test your smoke detector monthly?			
Do you change the batteries in your smoke detector when you change your clocks? (new smoke detectors have 10 year lithium batteries and only need to be replaced every 10 years - some have batteries built in and will require replacing the entire smoke detector)

Are electric outlets covered with child proof devices?			
Are electrical cords placed under rugs? (if yes - they should be removed)			
Do you have an address on your house that can be seen easily from the street?			
Do you have a home fire escape plan with a meeting place?			
Have you practiced your fire escape plan with your children?			
Have you identified two ways to exit each room in your home?			
Do you extinguish candles before leaving the room?			
Do children know that it is not ok to use adult tools, use or play with fires?			
<b>Basement, Garage and Outside</b>	<b>Yes</b>	<b>No</b>	<b>Fixed</b>
Do you know what the regulations are for outdoor debris burning?			
Are lawn and garden supplies and other poisons stored out of reach from children?			
Are flammable liquids stored in UL approved containers, labeled with contents and kept away from children?			
Do you keep leaves, pine needles and branches cleared from your roof?			
Do you keep dry grass and brush cleared away from your house to prevent fire from spreading from your or to your house?			
Do you maintain clear access to your house and fire hydrant for emergency personnel?			
Have you removed old boards with nails, broken glass and sharp objects from the yard and where children play?
